
RiteCare Services Expand to Keyser



Ill. Jamey S. Hill, 33° Personal Representative's Message



THE SYMBOLISM OF THE CAMP SCENE OF THE 32nd DEGREE

Of the many symbols of Scottish Rite perhaps none is more complex than the symbolic camp of the Thirty-second Degree. It's a symbol which brings together the preceding degrees in an encampment of "Masonic knights". Although early forms of the ritual describe the camp as a rallying point for the Masonic army, for most it is understood to be only symbolic. However, Albert Pike chose to use the camp scene using tents and banners to represent a gathering of the various degrees. In the early years of the 19th Century the Masonic Camp of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite continued as the basic symbol of the 32nd degree but now not so much as a defensive camp illustrating the secret purpose of Freemasonry as an army arrayed against the enemies of Masonry, but as a grand icon of all of the degrees of the rite together with the three degrees of the symbolic lodge.

The camp formed a review of what should have been learned in each of the preceding degrees. This summary was the backdrop for the unveiling of the Royal Secret of the Rite.

Following the Civil War and through the period of the Golden Age of Fraternalism, membership in Freemasonry and Scottish Rite soared. It was an era where men, many of whom were in the war, enjoyed marching in uniform as part of the degree work. With a strong belief that Masonry had developed from the ancient Knights Templar, the 32nd degree was essentially developed as the military degree. The members of the Consistory marched in uniforms with swords in highly detailed drills around the representation of the Camp before its secrets were revealed to the aspiring candidates.

The idea of an association of knights encamped against opposing forces was clearly behind the creation of the earliest known image of the camp icon copied by Henry Francken and shared with Etienne Morin sometime between 1762 and 1767. Morin developed a 25th degree system represented in the camp icon, with the final degree being styled the "Ne Plus Ultra" called Sovereign Prince of the Royal Secret or Knight of St. Andrew and Faithful Guardians of the Sacred Treasure", which indicated it was the final revelation of the mysteries of the Scottish Rite. It was for this reason that the Masonic Camp has been central to this degree. The numbers Morin used, as found in the French Rite of Perfection, were 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9, added together are 25, or the total degrees of the Morin system.

The initial content of the degree was from the previous degrees Francken had developed. The theme revolved around what we know today as the 30th Degree, wherein the seizure of the Knights Templar leadership by King Philip IV of France in 1307 and the dissolution of the Templar by Pope Clement V who transferred the assets to rival orders of the Templar. It is from these events that the Rite became the Knights of the Black Eagle, with their icon the black eagle enjoining with the white eagle of the Templar, to form the Knights of the Black and White Eagle with "a sword of vengeance in its claws, which all Kadosh are hereafter sworn to".

Albert Pike believed that the Camp summarized the structure as well as the moral duties and the philosophical tenets of the Rite through the use of symbolical geometrical forms represented by the Pythagorean sacred numbers.

The Camp consists of an outer polygon of nine sides (nonagon). Within the nonagon is a heptagon (seven sides); within that is a pentagon (five sides); and within the pentagon is an equilateral triangle (three sides). Within the triangle is a circle and within that a Saint Andrews Cross. The 32nd degree emphasizes the theory of the universe, as defined by our early Greek philosophers, whereby the concept of numbers and geometric forms and their mathematical relationships provided an intellectual way to understand the mysteries of the cosmos. The Degree emphasizes the specific numerical significance of the Numbers 3, 4, 5, 7 and 9. These numbers summarize the overall objective of this Degree which focuses on developing human perfection (number 5), on earth (number 4) so that mind, body and soul of Man (number 3) may win the struggle between opposite forces (good and evil) (number 7) and find perfection through the realization of the nature of God within himself (number 9).

As Albert Pike reiterated, that "symbolism is the soul of the Scottish Rite". This is the reason symbolism is the best teaching tool....it is the reason it works for all manners of men. But to make meaningful progress in life one must take a journey....in Masonry our journey is through ritual and symbolism. By applying both to our actions and thoughts we become better men. To quote from one source: "This is the essence of Masonic Knighthood - the acquisition of ever greater wisdom, which is equilibrium in thoughts and virtue, which is equilibrium in affections, just as the beauty is equilibrium in forms and colors. However, we must always keep in mind that our progress along the path of equilibrium demands moral strength, humility and caution."
