### Robin L. Summerfield, 32° Assistant Personal Representative's Message

I'll never forget the day I got my wings! After years in the cockpit at my father's side and after many hours of instruction in the classroom and the sky, I had finally earned the privilege to fly wherever and whenever I wanted without an instructor's permission. As dad, who had personally administered my flight test, signed my pilot

certificate he recited an expression I had heard him say to countless newly-minted pilots over the years: "Congratulations, here is your license to learn." This admonishment – what we in Masonry might call a charge – stuck with me as I continued my training in multi-engine and high-performance aircraft, instrument flight rules, and as a commercial pilot. In fact, these words have remained in the forefront of my mind throughout my adult life.

Education, in a skill or trade, in the liberal arts, and in Masonry is merely the beginning of wisdom. Master Masons are instructed, "gather instruction from thy youth up, thus wilt thou find wisdom in thine old age." As new Masons participate in the work of the symbolic degrees, they learn this principle as they receive new knowledge from the instructive tongue of their catechism instructor and mentors. As they serve their lodge in degree work and as officers they continue to gather instruction from the Worshipful Master, Past Masters, and other experienced brethren of their lodge.

The study of the Scottish Rite high degrees offers still further light in Masonry to those who earnestly seek, by increasing their knowledge, to improve their social intercourse. One pathway to explore the history and symbolism of these degrees is through the Scottish Rite Master Craftsman (SRMC) program.

I encourage everyone in our Valley, regardless of your time in the craft, your title, or your position, to consider enrolling in this program and taking part in one of our upcoming Master Craftsmen study groups.

Remember that Freemasonry is not a solitary pursuit, but rather a social experience — we gather in Lodges together for a reason! In fact, social engagement while finding more light in Masonry can be (and often is) more rewarding than simply answering some questions about a reading assignment. This is because you are learning not only about yourself through the ritual and its symbolism, but about others and their unique relationship to the deep philosophies and mysteries that are contained in the material, too.
