Articles about our Ladies Night and other activities are included in this issue. All reservations are to be submitted "with the proper stated fees". This policy needs to be followed to avoid the Rite from being liable for "no shows", this should be very understandable when you think about it.

Many members ask why the dues for Scottish Rite are \$72.00 and they still have to pay to attend our activities. From the \$72.00 submitted for your annual dues, \$22.00 goes to the Supreme Council for our per capita assessment. Another \$5.00 goes directly to our Cumberland Scottish Rite Foundation, and we pay to the Masonic Temple Association, Inc. another \$16.50 "per capita assessment" for Temple rent. That means that the Rite gets \$28.50 of your dues to manage our organization for the entire year. With total suspensions and numerous deaths each year, our membership is just over 800 members and over 100 are "dues exempt". You do the figures—this is not a pretty picture. Your dues are important, whether you are active or not. In 1995, our membership was over 1,700 and our dues were \$35.00, we didn't have this terrific overhead and things were fine. If our Valley has these problems, other Valleys have them also. So if you are a "dues exempt" member, maybe you might want to consider paying the \$22.00 per capita this year. It will increase \$2.00 each year for the next four years and our membership continues to decline. I want to personally thank each and every member for their continued support over these "rough times". Masons are a very special group of very special people—feel proud to be member of our fine Scottish Rite organization. Your Cumberland Scottish Rite now offers two scholarships to the Allegany College of Maryland and you as members of Scottish Rite are also members of our Scottish Rite Foundation. When submitting a dues payment, you also have an opportunity to make a "tax exempt" donation to your foundation. As they say in the television commercials: "WHATS IN YOUR WALLET? Take a moment and check your wallet. Hopefully your have a 2017 Scottish Rite card and more importantly your 2017 BLUE LODGE CARD. If you one year behind in your Blue Lodge, you are subject to suspension. Scottish Rite suspension is after two years in arrears, so if you are suspended in blue lodge, the Rite may be paying an assessment when you are no longer a mason, so we need to know your Masonic status. We need "up to date" communication between the blue lodges and the Rite. Hopefully all of our blue lodge secretaries are reporting suspensions to Scottish Rite secretaries.
