Robinette Continues in Leadership as Asst. Personal Representative

Longtime Secretary Recognized as Leander Schaidt Pillar of the Rite

After serving for four decades as Secretary-Registrar of the Valley of Cumberland Scottish Rite, Ill. Jerome F. Robinette, 33° has earned a well-deserved retirement in 2022. Bro. Robinette will remain on the leadership team in his new role as Assistant Personal Representative.

Jerry was recognized by the Valley of Cumberland in February 2022 for his service and fidelity to the craft with the Leander Schaidt Pillar of the Rite Award. This award marking Brother Robinette's distinction among Freemasons in Western Maryland was named in honor a man who, with Harry Footer, was one of the Valley of Cumberland's first two Inspectors General Honorary. Schaidt

served as Worshipful Master of Potomac Lodge No. 100, as Venerable Master of Meredith Lodge of Perfection (now Cumberland Lodge of Perfection) from 1910 – 1912, and as Secretary of the Valley of Cumberland Scottish Rite bodies for thirty years from 1913 until 1943. Robinette is the only brother to have served as Secretary of the Valley of Cumberland longer than Schaidt.

Jerry has been an active leader in the fraternity since being raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Fort Cumberland Lodge No. 211 in 1976. He received the Scottish Rite degrees the same year and joined the Ali Ghan Shriners where he soon filled his own father's shoes as the second Secretary of the Ali Ghan Ritualistic Unit, an office he has held since 1980. Indeed, the Scottish Rite quickly recognized his talents and called him into service as the tenth Secretary-Registrar for the Cumberland Coordinate Bodies in 1982. He was invested as a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour in 1983 and Coroneted as a 33° Inspector General Honorary in 1991. Jerry was further recognized by the Cumberland Scottish Rite as Freemason of the Tertia Centuria in 2017.

Mitzie worked as the Editor for too many years to count. It normally took about a month to bring the Perfect Elu to press. She always did her best to make the Scottish Rite look good in our newsletter. It wasn't always easy because our men are pretty basic, no-frills-attached kinda fellas. Not so much though for M, as we lovingly referred to her in texts to each other.

Now it is left to us to honor her forty years of service to our Team and to celebrate the legacy of hard work and commitment that Mitzie Robinette will leave behind. Mitzie often stopped to correct us when something didn't look just right – reminding us that “excellence is something to aim for daily” – and worked to fix the issue whatever it might be. She was big on details, was known among us as the backbone of the Scottish Rite, and would occasionally throw you a curve.

I'm reminded on one time in particular when she tried to stop a truck on Greene Street with her mere presence. We were on our way to a viewing at Upchurch Funeral Home – she can tell you whose viewing it was, I can't, we never made it inside. Jerry and M were crossing the dark, rain-soaked street when they were both struck by a pickup truck. Omitting the gory details, after enduring an hour of pain from a shattered hip while waiting to be treated in the Emergency Department, Mitzie had the nurses call me in the waiting room to tell me to make sure Jerry got checked out too! She was in charge all the time.

So to you, M, on behalf of the exceedingly grateful brethren of the Scottish Rite, I wish you a future filled with more of what you appreciate and less of what you don't. Cheers to your retirement as a person who has given so much of yourself to our cause! May these be the best and most rewarding years of your life. We love all that you have done. Now, go do all that you love.

Robert Burns Fundraiser Nets \$14,000 for RiteCare

**A-Thing-A-Ma-Jig Variety Show Comes to

After being sidelined by pandemic concerns in 2021, the Cumberland Scottish Rite Foundation returned to an active fundraising event schedule in 2022!

The 16th Annual Cumberland Knights of St. Andrew Burns Night Fundraiser made a triumphant return with a sold out event that raised \$14,000 from more than thirty-six sponsors and other contributions and the annual **Buck-A-Cup Fundraiser** netted \$4,000 to support our four local RiteCare clinics.

The Burns Night Fundraiser featured Scottish fare, toasts by the Knights and brethren, a captivating reading of Burns' poems by poet Gerry LaFemina, and traditional Celtic music by Shanty Irish. The duo of Pipe Major Andrew Donlon and Pipe Sergeant Thomas Cangelosi of the award-winning MacMillan Pipe Band were a true highlight of the event, offering several special numbers in addition to the festive Piping
