### A Time to Pick up Our Tools and Do More

The season of Advent in December and January is when those of the Christian faith around the world await and celebrate the birth of Jesus. The Bible informs us that John the Baptist was born six months before Jesus but provides no details as to the specific date or time of the year either was born. Some have raised questions about the date because the Bible also tells of the shepherds being in the field at the time of Jesus' birth. It is believed that the church appointed the date of Christ's birth in part to replace a pagan celebration of the winter solstice known as Saturnalia that had been practiced by ancient Romans before the rise of Christianity in Europe and the Middle East.

Regardless of its origins, the Christmas season is a joyous time of year. The thought of exchanging gifts with family and friends as well as Christmas decorations for the entire community must be nearly everyone's favorite time of year. Special Thanks to Chris Robey, Jim and Molly Arnold, and Ellen Hill for

decorating the Cumberland Masonic Temple in Christmas traditions from tree to poinsettias, nativity scene and little houses, and candles in the windows to keep a light on in honor of Him that would come.

The Knights of St. Andrew hosted their 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Festival of St. Andrew with special prayers offered for our salvation and hope for our future. This year, Dwight Metcalf called for a chorus of "Bless Be the Tie that Binds" to be sung by twenty-three of the best friends and voices in Freemasonry accompanied by Rick Haines on the piano.

P.S. the meal was to die for. The conversation that evening leaned toward the many parties being hosted by Masonic organizations at the Temple to celebrate the joy of the season.

Brethren, I have been troubled to learn of a growing Anti-Masonic sentiment across the nation and, indeed, within our own community during the past year. While there have always been those who would raise questions about the purposes and intentions of our gentle craft, we must be concerned when those questions transform into conspiracy theories and begin to creep into the family, faith, and politics of our very members.

Across our nation, those with significant influence have been promoting negative images of the fraternity on the airwaves, internet, and in pulpits with disturbing consequences. The distinguished Masonic author Ill. Christopher Hodapp, 33° has noted a major uptick in offensive online anti-Masonic commentary in recent months as well as a steady increase in reports of attacks on Masonic halls throughout the world in 2023 in the form of anti-Masonic graffiti, break-ins, arson fires, and other forms of deliberate damage. In July 2023, a brother in Texas was shot and killed in his lodge's parking lot, allegedly by an anti-Mason named Julio Diaz, who actually shot a video of the murder as it happened and posted it to his social media page. Similarly, credible threats toward Maryland lodges have been made in the past year. Meanwhile, some brethren have felt compelled to leave the fraternity to avoid the scorn and ridicule of pastors, family, and friends. Still other lifelong brethren have been denied Masonic memorial services by family members based on misinformation in the media and the counsel of Anti-Masonic voices. This cuts deeply as we have several local members of the clergy in our craft, and I am perplexed to understand the grievances of their Anti-Masonic colleagues.

The Covid-19 pandemic certainly struck a blow to participation for many organizations – including houses of worship and Masonic lodges – and many of our brothers have been slow to return to their churches and lodges as restrictions were lifted. As annual membership notices are hitting mailboxes, I suspect that church pledge cards for the upcoming year are slowly trickling in at a similar rate as lodge dues and both are rightfully concerned about maintaining members and meeting annual budgets. Rather than competing for the active participation and critical financial support of our mutual members, it is my hope that our local congregations and lodges will work together to encourage them to return to actively supporting the important work of *both* houses of worship *and* Masonic lodges in our community.

In the spirit of Christmas, I am reminded of one of the most important ideas that our Grand Commander Jim Cole conveys, "Scottish Rite asks in general more of its members than Blue Masonry. The Scottish Rite asks for more understanding from its members, for more courage to take on the big jobs, and for more Kindness. Kindness to your neighbor, more importantly kindness to one another as there are many who seek preferment."

In closing, when we lay down our working tools some of us will look forward to knowing that our brethren will conduct a Masonic memorial service to show sympathy to our loved ones and share our strong faith in the immortality of the soul. In the months and weeks to come, let us keep the folks in Ukraine and Israel in mind, as well as our nation's leaders, and may the words of my mouth and the meditations of our hearts be acceptable in Thy sight, O Lord.

May this note find you in good health now and always and may you have a very Happy and Blessed New Year!

The Children's currently League is serving approximately 30 clients at the Oakland Clinic and more than 160 across the four clinics in Cumberland and Oakland

in Maryland and Keyser and Petersburg in West Virginia.

This year's event saw an increase in participants with nearly 100 golfers taking to the links on a beautiful and crisp October Saturday. Even better, the event surpassed its fundraising goal by 50% to raise \$22,000 for RiteCare. Plans are already underway to make this event even bigger in 2024.
