Valley of Cumberland Growing in Numbers and Striving for Excellence Fall One-Day Class Set for October 25



10th Annual Masonic Bird Hunt to Support RiteCare

n November 1, the Cumberland Scottish Rite Foundation will host the 10th Annual Masonic bird hunt to benefit four Scottish Rite Children's Speech Language Clinics in Western Maryland and West Virginia's Eastern Panhandle.

Chip Zimmer, (KCCH), founder of the hunt, explained the thought behind the idea. "We wanted to offer a fun and recreational event that was unique and appealed to a different Masonic audience, while at the same time recognizing our Masonic Heritage (Davy Crockett was a Freemason)."

The first hunt was held in 2017 at Quail Hollow Hunting Preserve in Berkely Springs, WV. In 2022, it was moved to OnPoint Hunting Preserve in Addison, PA. Nearly 100 shooters have joined in the fun and competition. Prizes have ranged. from bottles of Bird Dog Whiskey (The Davy Crockett) Best Shooter Award), to frozen turkeys (Best Team Award) to chicken livers (The Bent Barrel Award). In 2018 Capt. Sydney Church-Stenger (USA) became our first female shooter.

Personal Representative, Jamey Hill, 33° credited Zimmer, "Chip is the reason that we're entering our 10th year. The men liked it and it's a fun way to support the clinics. That we could raise some money toward our Scottish Rite charity made it a perfect combination!" In 9 years, nearly \$10,000 has been raised to support

the Rite Care clinics."

Each group of four or five shooters has a guide, dog, and birds - pheasant, chukar and quail. The cost is \$185, a portion of which is tax deductible. Contact Rob Elliott at 724-984-1484 for details. RSVP at cumberlandscottishrite.org.


